EACHSA is a Charitable Trust set up to provide Educational Aid to the **CH**ildren of **Southern Africa**. You will find full details on our website www.EACHSA.org.uk.

The Trust collects second-hand children’s books (pencils/crayons/soft toys) to send to southern Africa for schools and children who simply have none. The response to collections across the UK has been tremendous. We need to ship the books on a continuing basis and have set up a “100 Club” to help meet shipping costs.

For those of you who aren’t familiar with 100 Clubs, the idea is that 100 or more people give a monthly amount and, depending on the amount they want to give, are allocated one or more entries into a draw each month. A whopping 55% of the sum raised is returned in prizes to lucky winners chosen at random. Each monthly entry to our Club Draw is £5. The full Rules of the Club are attached.

100 entries at £5 each mean monthly prizes totalling £275! The money retained by the Trust pays for several shipments per year.

THE EACHSA TRUST “100 CLUB” RULES

1. The subscription to the “100Club” is payable by monthly or yearly standing order. However, Trustees have discretion to accept cheques for a yearly subscription.
 2. Members may have multiple subscriptions.
 3. Membership is open to all over the age of 18.
 4. The membership year runs from 1st April to 31st March.
 5. Ticket numbers will be allocated sequentially as application forms are received.
 6. Tickets will be priced at £5 each per monthly draw or £60 per annum.
 7. Subscriptions must be received by the 25th of each month to be eligible for the monthly draw, which will take place on the last day of each month.
 8. Members wishing to join after the membership year has begun may pay monthly, or be charged a pro rata yearly subscription payable by cheque.
 9. The “100 Club” shall not be limited to 100 members or numbers.
 10. The decision of the Trustees shall be final in all matters that require adjudication. The Trustees have the right to refuse any entry.
 11. Each member is allocated a permanent number or numbers, which will remain the member’s provided that their subscription is up to date.
 12. Cancellation of subscriptions should be made in writing, preferably by e-mail, after which the relevant numbers will be withdrawn from the following draw.
 13. Monthly prizes will be awarded according to membership of the “100 Club” for that month as follows:

Winner	25% of subscriptions collected for the month
Second Prize	15% of subscriptions collected for the month
Third Prize	10% of subscriptions collected for the month
Fourth Prize	5% of subscriptions collected for the month
- Prizes will be rounded down to the nearest whole £.
- Additional occasional prizes may be allocated at the discretion of the Trustees.
14. Results of the draw will be displayed on the website www.EACHSA.org.uk and winners will be notified by e-mail (or telephone if no e-mail address) as soon as practicable after the draw.
 15. Payments for prizes will be sent by cheque to the winners by the 7th of the month following the draw.
 16. The funds received from member subscriptions and not awarded as prizes will be credited to the EACHSA Trust Account and may be used as the Trustees determine in accordance with the Rules of the Trust.
 17. Gift Aid may be claimed on all monies raised after prizes and expenses have been deducted if shown on the original application form.
 18. Club members will be notified in advance of any amendments or additions to these Rules that may be necessary in future.
 19. The “100 Club” will be run in accordance with the Gambling Act 2005. The promoter is Mrs J Riley, Trustee, licensed by Colchester Borough Council: Registration Number 069206. Educational Aid for the **CH**ildren of **S**outhern **A**frica

The EACHSA Trust has been set up by a group of friends who are making a difference to the lives of children in the poorest areas of Southern Africa.

We know that, in the refugee and squatter camps and the poorest parts of townships and villages there are children who do not have parents because of violence, HIV/AIDS and poor living conditions. Often they have no homes, just shanties, tents or a piece of tarpaulin. The children suffer from poor sanitation and inadequate nutrition. There are many charities and organisations that help with physical living conditions.

But we wanted to do something else to help.

The children of southern Africa speak dozens of different languages, but at school they learn in English. Some of the schools are very poorly equipped; some have no tables, desks or chairs. Some classrooms have no walls or roof: only a teacher sitting under a tree. Professor Bergman was at one school in November 2009 where they proudly showed him their one printed resource, a very old, nearly complete, copy of the Encyclopaedia Britannica. He also visited a school where they had 10 books, but because they are so precious the children are not allowed to touch them. Thank goodness, both places, amongst many others now have a regular supply of literacy material.

We can't imagine our children learning to read without books and under those conditions and we want to help. We also want them to experience a little of the joy and wonder that we and our own children have had from books. We can do that by sending as many books as possible. They are shipped via our southern Africa co-ordinator, Mrs Zinette Bergman and distributed via 'outreach programmes' of various universities. No-one is paid for their work either in UK or abroad and the funds we raise go on shipping, insurance etc.
